COVID Rules

- 1. All participants will be required to comply with the latest government COVID-19 advice and guidance and in accordance with the terms of a risk assessment undertaken by the Lady Llanover Society. It should be noted that provisions can be varied at short notice including cancellation of the event if a local lockdown is imposed in which case participants will be fully refunded.
- 2. All participants are required to undertake a lateral flow test at home on the morning of the event and confirm on arrival this has proved negative. Free test kits can be obtained from https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests.
- 3. In particular the following should be noted-:
 - a. The Hall can only be entered by people that do not have Covid-19 symptoms themselves and no member of their household either.
 - b. Participants are advised to adhere to physical distancing.
 - c. Participants are requested to adhere to a one-way system with no queuing/waiting in foyer areas. Details will be available on a site plan.
 - d. Please bring your own sanitising gel and sanitise your hands regularly. Sanitising stations will also be available on the day.
 - e. Face coverings are advised when circulating until seated at a harp when use will be at the discretion of the participant.
 - f. The main kitchen will be available for teas and coffees. Participants are requested to bring their own packed lunch.
 - g. The Society is required to record the names and contact details of all entering the building and the data will be held for 21 days. The Lady Llanover Society is required to notify the Llanfoist Village Hall committee if a hall user has been tested positive for Coronavirus.
- 4. <u>Your safety is our priority</u>. Prior to the event all participants will receive an email containing the following information-:
 - a. A Covid-19 risk assessment.
 - b. A site plan showing arrangements for access and exit.
 - c. A programme for the day.
 - d. A consent form to be completed by parents where minors are attending.
- 5. Beginner taster sessions will be held in the small committee room with limited numbers. Participants will be asked to attend at a particular time slot. Organisers will allow sufficient time between sessions to ventilate the room and sanitise surfaces and instruments.
- 6. All participants in the intermediate and advanced classes must bring their own harp, stool and music stand.
- 7. Participants will be asked to complete a short application form, to include the names of any guests attending the Concert (maximum of 2 per participant) so that seating can be arranged to comply with Covid 19 regulations.



COVID-19 Risk Assessment

What are the hazards?	Action to be taken to control the risk
1 The development of basic symptoms (cough, temperature and shortness of breath) before coming to the event or a positive test result.Transmission of the Covid - 19 virus through close physical contact.	 All participants are required to undertake a Lateral Flow Test at home on the morning of the event and confirm on arrival that this has proved negative. Do not come to the event but remain at home and follow Welsh Government Guidelines on self-isolation and test and trace in the event of a positive result. Free test kits from -: https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests The Hall can only be entered by people that do not have Covid-19 symptoms themselves and no member of their household has symptoms either. Users that have recovered from Covid-19 can use the Hall provided that all members of their household have completed the required isolation period. If symptoms develop whilst at the event a representative of the Lady Llanover Society will arrange for the individual to be isolated outside the building, weather permitting or alternatively in the lobby area, make arrangements for the individual to go home and supervise them at a safe social distance wearing a mask and apron. Also anyone who has touched an unwell individual should wash their hands with soap and water or sanitise their hands. All participants will be required to record their name, contact details and date and time of entering the building.
2 Hygiene risks begin before entering the building	 Sanitising stations will be provided for use during the day. Use the sanitisers provided on entry or when moving from one area to another. A one-way system as indicated on a plan attached to this risk assessment is to be maintained. Please note there is only one point of entry. No queuing in the foyer area. Participants are requested to maintain social distancing and enter the building one by one for registration. Entrance doors will be closed during sessions to prevent other people entering the building.
3 Key transmission risk areas within the building are surfaces, table tops, seats and toilet facilities	 Please assume that all surfaces are potentially contaminated, therefore, regularly clean or sanitise your hands. Please bring your own sanitising gel. It is good practice for users to wipe down toilet seats, flush handles and sink surfaces following the "if you use it - wipe it" principle. All must maintain social distancing whilst using the toilets.
4 Using other peoples equipment	 Participants should only play or use their own harp or one provided by a tutor which will be sanitised before use.
5 Lack of proper ventilation.	 The Health and Safety Executive recommends the opening of windows and doors during activities to maximise ventilation. It is advised that face coverings should be worn continuously throughout the session if doors and windows remain<u>shut.</u>
6 Sharing food	 Do not share food or drink with anyone else. Participants are advised to bring their own packed lunch, including water.
7 Seating hygiene	All seats should be wiped with sanitising wipes after use and before being used by someone new.
8 Face coverings	 Face coverings should be worn whilst moving about the building and when physical distancing cannot be maintained. Use when seated at a harp is at the discretion of the participant.
Action by Lady Llanover Society Representatives	 A minimum 15 minute gap will be maintained between beginner taster sessions in order that the room can be ventilated and sanitised. The Lady Llanover Society is required to record the names and contact details of all entering the building and the data will be held for 21 days and then destroyed. The Lady Llanover Society is required to notify the Llanfoist Village Hall committee if a hall user has tested positive for the Codid-19 virus. Lady Llanover representatives will undertake cleaning of work surfaces during the course of the day. A supply of gloves, disposable towels, aprons, sanitising gel and masks will also be provided by the Society.
